Kathleen Connachie, whose Funeral Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday, 14th May at 11:00am in OLW Church. The Rite of Reception into Church is on Monday, 13th May at 4:30pm in OLW.

Singing and making the responses is a pivotal part of Catholic worship. In the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (*Sacrosanctum Concilium*) we read that singing is encouraged so that our voices can ring out to God (#118) and our faith is nourished (#33)! Thus, the choir and/or cantor are leaders that we follow rather than people we listen to. By singing and **offering the responses** we are participants in the Mass and not spectators. St Augustine said to sing is to pray twice; so, we don't need to be a great singer, all that is necessary is a lively faith. We must also be good examples to the children and young people at Mass so that they are able to join in the singing and responses! Please consider coming to this:

The Diocesan Music Day "Alleluia!" is on Saturday, 11th May from 11:00am to 3:30pm at Thomas Becket School, Northampton. All cantors, choir members, etc. are most welcome. The **Parish Litany** will be offered after Mass unless there is a recessional hymn. This begins with the St Michael the Archangel Prayer for in 2018 Pope Francis urged its revival in recognition of the fracturing of the unity of the Catholic Church and the sexual abuse revelations; it also includes the saint dedications of all our Corby parishes and a prayer for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

Our Lady of Lourdes & Ferrero Rocher! Michele Ferrero named his company "Rocher" after the *Rocher de Massabielle* in Lourdes where Our Lady appeared to St Bernadette and he added symbolism to the chocolates: the rough coating and gold wrapping resemble the rocky outcrop and the nut inside represents Our Lady in the grotto. Whilst 13th May is the memorial of Our Lady of Fatima, there might be a chocolate treat, in honour of Our Lady of Lourdes, to take home with you after the Marian Novena.

The Liturgy Commission have organised a training day for using the **new translation of the lectionary** which comes into force in Advent. This gathering is in Luton on Tuesday, 11th June; it is hoped that every parish will be represented. All responsible for delivering the sacred liturgy are invited: Readers, Catechists, choir members, cantors, musicians, etc. The day will familiarise people with the new lectionary and remind us how to correctly introduce and conclude the Scriptures (which was changed with the 2011 Missal).
