In the parable of the Pharisee and the Publican (Lk 18:9–14) Jesus teaches about humility and the need to recognise our sins. The sorrow for our sins is called: contrition, which comes from the Latin *conterere*, which means: to break. The way of showing contrition at Mass happens when we strike our chest during the "I confess…" - it's as if we are seeking to break our stony hearts!

The Sacrifice of the Mass is offered for four 'purposes': Adoration, Thanksgiving, Atonement and Petition; under the Old Testament laws different sacrifices were prescribed for each of these but all were superseded by Christ's Perfect Sacrifice on the Holy Cross. As Catholics we believe that the Sacrifice of Christ is renewed in the Sacrifice of the Mass; here Jesus is both Priest and Victim. In the offering of Mass we are, for a moment, an actual witness to the uniting of Heaven and Earth. When Holy Mass is offered using the three sacred languages of Latin (*Sanctus, Agnus Dei*, etc), **Greek** (Kyrie) and **Hebrew** (Alleluia, Hosanna, etc.) we employ the three languages that we used for the inscription on the Holy Cross that read: Jesus of Nazareth is King (Jn 19:19-20).

The liturgical aim of Vatican II was that the Baptised should play a truly active, full and conscious part in the Mass by offering the **responses**, **singing** and making the **liturgical actions**.

★ "Picture then the High Priest Christ leaving the sacristy of heaven for the altar of Calvary. He has already put on the vestment of our human nature, the maniple of our suffering, the stole of priesthood, the chasuble of the Cross. Calvary is his cathedral; the rock of Calvary is the altar stone; the sun turning to red is the sanctuary lamp; Mary and John are the living side altars; the Host is His Body; the wine is His Blood. He is upright as Priest, yet He is prostrate as Victim. His Mass is about to begin." - Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, Calvary and the Mass.

the London-born, 15-year-old, who in AD 2006 died of cancer, will soon be declared a saint! *"It is a real answer* to prayer that Blessed Carlo Acutis will be the first millennial saint: a saint our young people can really look up to," said Bishop Hudson. Every day Carlo read the Scriptures and prayed the rosary, he collected clothes for the poor, he defended children being bullied at school, he visited the Blessed Sacrament each

day, plus created a website and exhibit about Eucharistic Miracles from every age. ⊁ Blessed Carlo prayer cards will be distributed before Mass today so that together we can seek his intercession.

Reparation to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus:

The value of "reparation" in the Church was the topic of a recent conference in Rome to commemorate the 350th anniversary of the apparitions of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St Margaret Mary



Alacoque. A great need for reparation has arisen in the Church, marked as she is, by the abuse of minors, division and eucharistic sacrilege. In his speech to the participants Pope Francis recalled that true reparation is brought about by Jesus and His redemptive sacrifice on the Cross. In his closing remarks, the Pope expressed his earnest desire that the practice of reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus be renewed as "today it

is somewhat forgotten or wrongly considered obsolete". Perhaps we might gaze upon the image of the Sacred Heart in our Church and home and offer reparation and prayer for victims of clerical abuse, disrespectful acts toward Jesus truly present in the Holy Eucharist and the healing of divisions within the Catholic Church?

...is a Solemnity so we can eat meat, though it is not compulsory!
