Blessed Carlo Acutis - The First Millennial Saint:



In five simple practices, that anyone can all adopt, Blessed Carlo had a "roadmap" to heaven - 1: Holy Mass. 2: Eucharistic Adoration. 3: Devotion to Our Lady and the Saints. 4: Confession and Spiritual Guidance. 5: Acts of charity. These five practices led Carlo to a life of intimacy with Jesus and love for his neighbour; he is thus a reminder to us that authentic holiness is possible at any age. Indeed, Pope Benedict XVI challenged young

people to be "glowing saints, in whose eyes and hearts the love of Christ beams". The call to sanctity in this life comes to us from Jesus Himself who said: "Be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect" (Mt 5:48). Through the great Paschal Mystery - Jesus' suffering, death, Resurrection and Ascension - offers us the grace, by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and the Sacraments, to truly become perfect; thus, when we fail, as we all do, we return to the Sacrament of Mercy: Confession. In his final days, Carlo said: "I am happy to die because I have lived my life without wasting a minute on those things which do not praise God." What a truly extraordinary witness to Christ he is! *Blessed Carlo: Pray for us.*

The Relic of St Thomas Becket

will be available from 6th to 8th July for veneration to coincide with the Festival in the Cathedral. This will be solemnly brought into OLW on 6th July at 9:00am and this will be followed by devotions and Holy Mass at 9:30am. **All welcome!**

Pope Francis has expressed his earnest desire



for the renewal of true reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus; let us do so for all clerical abuse victims, sacrilegious acts toward Christ in the Holy Eucharist and for divisions within the Catholic Church. A photograph of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is in the porch for us to display at home in order to seek the Lord's blessing upon where we live. O Most Sacred Heart of Jesus: Have mercy on us!

A National Eucharistic Congress is being celebrated at Oscott: St Mary's College on Saturday, 14th September to commemorate the first Eucharistic Procession which took place in England since the Reformation; it is also a part of the national preparations for the 2025 Jubilee Year. The hope is that every Catholic in England and Wales will deepen their understanding of the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. The celebrations at Oscott will include Angelus & Holy Mass, Eucharistic Procession with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament, Holy Rosary Walk, Pilgrimage Walk, a keynote address, plus activities such as a presentation about Blessed Carlo Acutis, visits to the museum, etc. A very limited number of tickets are available and these will be allocated on a "first come, first served" basis; if you are interested in attending the National Eucharistic Congress please contact Fr Christopher. In order that every Catholic can be a part of the 53rd International Eucharistic Congress and this National Eucharistic Congress, the Bishops request that all parishes hold a Holy Hour on Sunday, 15th September; for us this will take place in SJO Church at 3:45pm.
